Think Tank Releases New Study Supporting NHS Top-ups

The Stockholm Network today releases its fourth in a series of studies on Health Technology Assessment (HTA). The report, What Price for a Year of Life? The Threshold Discussion in Health Technology Assessment, looks at how HTA bodies such as Britain's NICE make their decisions on what treatments and drugs constitute value for money.

Typically, bodies like NICE measure the benefits of a treatment as the period by which a patient's life is extended and improved (using a measurement known as Quality Adjusted Life Years – QALY). But once this figure is known, up to what cost per year should a treatment be considered 'cost-effective' meaning that its benefits are worth the costs of the state financing this medicine? Is there a monetary threshold above which a new medicine should not be reimbursed (or, in other words, should be denied) in a given country? These are just some of the major issues that the paper examines.

Commenting on yesterday's announcement that the NHS will allow patients to top-up their NHS covered drug treatment, Stockholm Network's Director of Research and one of the report's authors, Dr Meir Pugatch, said:

"The threshold concept is too static a way of evaluating drugs and medical treatments. It's a principle largely based on a 'one-size fits all' model. Instead, public health care systems should allow more patient flexibility and greater co-operation between public and private health providers. Top-ups is an excellent way to start."
