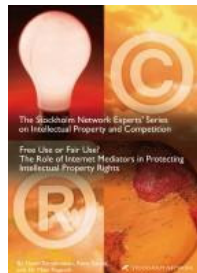
The Stockholm Network was delighted to announce the appointment of **Sukanya Natarajan** as a research officer for the Intellectual Property and Competition programme.
